

ArborMaster Safety and Class Ground Rules

Our goal at ArborMaster is simple yet ambitious – to provide the best quality arborist education and training in the country to improve safety and productivity within the industry.

Safety is of the utmost importance during the program. We take our responsibility to educate and train very seriously; therefore we strive to provide the safest environment possible at which to deliver our services.

The following are the class rules that we would like you to be familiar with, not only for your safety, but the safety of your fellow students and instructors. These rules will be enforced.

Participant responsibilities during class:

- ArborMaster requires that all participants bring and wear their own personal protective equipment (PPE) which must be in good working order.
- Some items being worn when performing tree work can be dangerous. For safety sake, we require the following during class. If you have any questions regarding these requirements please call the ArborMaster office for further clarification.
 - Be sure you are not wearing items that can be entangled such as drawstrings, banadanas, loose clothing, etc
 - If you have long hair, please tie back and tuck underneath your helmet or shirt
 - Remove all exposed and/or loose jewelry or jewelry that can otherwise be entangled or snagged by anything
- If a participant is being disruptive during class, then he or she will be taken aside and the issue will be addressed. ArborMaster reserves the right to suspend or expel any participant for such behavior.
- If a participant is under the influence of alcohol or drugs or otherwise incapacitated while attending class, he or she will not be allowed to participate in any activity that may put him/her or others in danger. Failure to participate in said activities may result in the participant's inability to complete the class. ArborMaster reserves the right to suspend or expel any participant for such behavior.
- If a participant appears unwilling or unable to respond to instructions, he or she will be asked to cease participating in the day's activities. ArborMaster reserves the right to suspend or expel any participant from its program for insubordinate behavior.
- If a participant comes to class unable to perform fully to the technical standards of the program and/or the functions essential to class participation, he or she will not be allowed to participate in the class.
- If a participant has been inaccurate in any manner in any of his or her registration forms, ArborMaster reserves the right to deny such participant entry to the class or any further participation in class work not yet performed.
